ADVANCED TRAUMA LIFE SUPPORT PROVIDER COURSE (ATLS®-P)

ATLS® is the standard of care identified by the American College of Surgeons (ACS) for physicians who intervene with trauma victims at all levels of clinical practice. ATLS® utilizes a systematic, concise methodology for assessment and initial stabilization of the multiple-injured patient. Lectures and interactive practicums address initial assessment, airway & ventilation, shock, thoracic trauma, abdominal trauma, head trauma, spine & spinal cord trauma, musculoskeletal trauma, burn & cold injuries, trauma of pediatric, geriatric and obstetric patients, and transfer considerations. ATLS® courses are presented in conjunction with the ACS Ohio Committee on Trauma.

ENPC® INSTRUCTOR COURSE (ENPC-I)

The Instructor Course is designed to prepare Providers with Instructor Potential to become instructors. The ENPC-I course emphasizes appropriate teaching strategies as well as correct evaluation methods. Registrants must successfully complete a written exam and the Management of the Ill & Injured Child skill station to continue with the course.

TRAUMA NURSING CORE COURSE (TNCC®)

Developed by the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA), TNCC® is identified nationally by the ACS as the minimum standard of trauma nursing education for trauma nurses. TNCC® encompasses core knowledge and interactive skill sessions to aid the trauma nurse in methodically assessing and intervening for critical trauma victims including trauma epidemiology, biomechanics and mechanisms of injury; initial assessment and stabilization of the trauma victim; brain, craniofacial, thoracic, abdominal, spinal cord/vertebral column and burn trauma; shock; geriatric, pediatric, and obstetric trauma considerations; psychological trauma; and transfer and transport of the trauma victim. Experienced nurses may opt to challenge the course. For more information on challenging, call Janelle Glasgow, RNC, CPEN at 614-255-4396. TNCC courses are held on consecutive Fridays.

Please note that only registered nurses may participate in the testing of the psychomotor skill stations and the written examination.
